COVID-19 PANDEMIC PROCEDURES – 2020 SEASON

All Olde New England Lacrosse League (ONELL, the “League”) participants (players, coaches, officials) shall follow CDC Guidelines and/or state-level guidelines regarding personal hygiene and safety protocols. Additionally, League participants shall follow venue-level guidelines and requirements, wherever required and stated.

By participating in a League game, all participants certify that they do not have a fever, nor do they exhibit any other signs of illness. All participants are required to self-quarantine for 14-days and refrain from attending ONELL games, if they have a fever or exhibit any of the stated COVID-19 related symptoms.

Participants shall be prepared to wear face coverings/masks between their vehicles and the playing field. This means every participant has a face covering/mask at the field.

Participants shall use their own personal equipment. Personal equipment may not be shared and must be dedicated to an individual player throughout the season. Personal equipment includes all gear that is worn by players (e.g., gloves, helmets, masks, footwear, pads, etc.). Participants are responsible for “sanitizing” their personal equipment.

Whenever possible on the field, players shall attempt to follow social distancing guidelines when “off ball” / away from the direct play of the ball. Participants shall attempt to follow social distancing guidelines whenever possible on the sidelines and substitution area.

Any team participant who is not suited up to play in a League game should also wear face covering/mask while on the sideline.

Participants shall place gear bags along the sidelines, if permitted, with social distancing buffer zones between bags. Best practice is to get your gear on at the car/parking lot, and carry only what you need to the field. Some venues mandate that procedure.

Participants and spectators should only drink from their own containers. No spitting!

Spectators must be limited to ensure social distancing on the sidelines or other observation areas. All spectators must wear face coverings/masks.
